Mr. Endacott (Cont.)

Proposed Arena

Building permits

In the month of September there were 96 permits for a value of \$4,39,584.. This compares with September, 1967 when there were 75 permits issued for a value of \$295,863. The total to date is 689 permits for a value of \$3,623,466.
