Dow Chemical Limited -
 Re: Water Treatment Seminar

Stating that seminars are to be held in certain locations throughout the province and one will be held in New Westminster on November 21st. For the benefit of municipalities who cannot be represented at the seminars, a copy of the papers presented will be made available.

R.C.M.P. - Re: Bradshaw Road Diversion

Recommending the institution of a thirty mile per hour speed limit on this portion of road, and also the provision of a cross walk on Carvolth Road at this location. It was noted that the cross walk had already been approved by Council. Alderman Booth suggested that the entire stretch of Carvolth Road from Langley City to just south of Bradshaw Road diversion should be thirty miles per hour.

On motion of Aldermen Booth and Jensen Garvolth Road from the City of Langley to Bradshaw Road diversion is to be posted at thirty mile per hour speed limit. Alderman Blair voted contrary.

On motion of Aldermen Booth and Shuster the Bradshaw Road diversion is to be posted at thirty miles per hour speed limit. Alderman Blair voted contrary.
