A meeting of the Public Works Subcommittee was held in the Municipal Hall, Murrayville, B. C. on Tuesday, January 14th, 1969 at 1:00 p.m.

Present Were:

Alderman Woolley (Chairman) Mayor Poppy, Aldermen Blair and Jensen. The Municipal Clerk also attended the meeting.

Robert's Bank Railway Link

Mr. J. J. McLellan visited the Mayor and suggested the municipality should bear the following points in mind when discussing the proposed link from the C.N.R. to the B. C. Hydro railway:

1. Extension of Brown Road to river's edge should be protected.
2. Culvert with flood-gate on end will have to be protected.
3. Drainage system from Brown Road to Salmon River will be crossed and could be interfered with.

The Clerk was instructed to contact B. C. Hydro officials to obtain information on the planning of this railway link.

1969 Budget

The projected works programme was studied by the Committee.

New Construction

The Chairman recommended that tenders be called on the construction of new roads in the municipal land to be offered for sale. This would provide comparison with municipal costs.

Reconstruction of Paved Roads

Delete Livingstone Road

\$43,000.

Hired Equipment

Delete hired bulldozer from programme

10,000.

Delete hired gradall (part) from programme

5,000.

Equipment

Appropriate from equipment reserve

24,000.

Anticipated trade-in on Hydroexcavator

8,000.

Finance gradall over two years (this will save)

28,000.

Future Programme

1. Is the Public Works Department operating unit an economical size for the future?

A - expect the bulldozer and one grader will not be replaced and this will reduce the size of the unit.

2. Are we trying to bring too many roads, particularly dead-end roads, up to a high standard?

A - it costs money to maintain these small roads and this can be reduced by flush-coating and paving.

The future operating programme of the Public Works Department will be given further consideration by the Committee and a report submitted.
