UNFINISHED BUSINESSElection Results

The Returning Officer submitted a report on the election results, which is attached to these minutes as Schedule No. 5.

This report was received on motion of Aldermen Jensen and Woolley.

Hudson's Bay Avenue

The discussion of this matter is covered in the report of the Special Meeting held at Fort Langley on December 3rd, 1969. Alderman Blair stated that the reconstruction of the Fort is important to the entire municipality of Langley, and suggested that the closure of the road should be contingent on further improvement work being commenced on the restored fort site.

On motion of Aldermen Jensen and Blair the National Historic Sites Branch is to be notified that Council is prepared to close a portion of this road, and requesting that negotiations be undertaken to discuss the details of this road closure.

Roberts Bank Railway

Mr. Scales, the C.N.R. Engineer and Mr. Wedler, the Engineer of Willis, Cunliffe, Falt and Co. attended the meeting.

Rawlison Crescent Crossing

Mr. Wedler stated that he had discussed the plans with Mr. Scales, and amendments have been made to provide a better line of sight and gradient of the road where the underpass occurs at the Rawlison Road.

On motion of Aldermen Woolley and Breier these revised plans were approved subject to the final plan drawings being submitted to the municipality for approval and signature.

River Road

The Municipal Clerk read a letter from Mr. Cunliffe of the Consulting Engineers which stipulated that there must be a total of 200 feet free between the Brown Road intersection and the place where cars stop for the railway, and Mayor Poppy requested Mr. Scales to make note of this in the planning of this crossing.

Mayor Poppy made reference to the drainage ditch problem at Rawlison Crescent, which had been brought to Council's attention by Dr. Davidson, and asked Mr. Scales to take note of this also.

Public Works Subcommittee

Alderman Woolley stated that this Committee would meet on Thursday, December 10th, 1969 at 10:00 a.m. to make the tour of various items, which have been placed before Council.

NEW BUSINESS48th Avenue and Fraser Highway

Alderman Barichello stated that the street light at this intersection is not satisfactory. Mayor Poppy replied that the angle of the road makes it very difficult to illuminate this intersection properly.

On motion of Aldermen Barichello and Woolley the R.C.M.P. are to be asked for advice on the illumination of this intersection.
